2. Course and Curriculum Development

- a. *Sociology 134xw, Introduction to Sociology: Distance Learning.* With David Schweingruber created and developed a distance learning version of the large enrollment introduction to sociology course that has been taught continuously since the Fall of 2005. Delivery fee from this course funds introduction to sociology undergraduate teaching assistants, including those in Sociology Central. Summer 2005-2008
- b. *Sociology 235 Social Problems and American Values.* Created a large enrollment version (increased from 90 to 200 students per semester) of this popular course that meets the American Diversity general education requirement. The course is designed to be accessible to first year students (it is a featured course in the LAS first year experience) and remain challenging and relevant to graduating seniors. The course was explicitly designed for our land grant university: it focuses upon practical learning and democratic citizenship. Developed and incorporated streaming video assignments into the course to make connections between course content and contemporary political issues. The course fills quickly, even with enrollment capped at 200. Affiliated faculty connected to the course through LAS Connections Initiative: Leonard Sadosky, Eric Northway.
- c. *Sociology 134 Introduction to Sociology.* Created computer-enhanced, multi-media, critical and historical introductory course specially tailored to the large class environment at ISU with the goal of increasing student involvement while fulfilling the democratic mission of our land-grant university. Materials created for the course have been refined by student feedback and are currently being used by colleagues in other institutions, including Augustana College, Sioux Falls, SD, where I was invited to give an enhanced presentation to students and faculty using these course materials. I plan to publish this material as a book: *Sociology Reloaded: A Critical Introduction to Modernity*. Affiliated faculty connected to the course through LAS connections initiative: Steffen Schmidt.

3. Scholarship of Teaching
